Class Topic/Date	Class Description	Instructor
Geography of China 中国地理 – 6/6	This class covers topics including geographic location, major rivers and surface features such as lakes and mountains, natural resource distributions, flora and fauna, public administrative systems and nationalities. Online Chinese Conversational Class

A Background Intro

This course will help students to develop conversational skills, such as listening and speaking Chinese. It is designed for non Chinese heritage students and/or students who have a desire for conversational skills, especially those students whose schools do not provide the Chinese program but want to have a taste of learning it. A spiral-up, step-by-step approach will be adopted to reinforce and build upon material from previous lessons, and emphasizes speaking and comprehension. Most commonly used characters and sentence patterns will be studied within highly-relevant topics with daily, useful vocabulary. Little Star Chinese School is offering this new ten-day's course to the current students during this temporary seclusive time period, and this course is expected to be continued in the future.

Course Description

The Conversational Chinese introduces students to the basic skills of speaking, listening and reading for the purpose of communication with a language learning method based on a series of icons placed grammatically and interpreted as full complex sentences. The pictorial icons serve as visual cues that enable students to talk.
